

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#### Information on discs

DVD player is an optional feature.

#### Precautions for handling discs

- After using a disc, put the disc back in its original case to prevent disc scratches.
- Do not use abnormally shaped discs (8cm, heart-shaped, octagon-shaped) as such discs could lead to malfunctions.
- Do not clean discs with chemical solutions, such as alcohol, benzene or thinners.
- Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or high temperatures for prolonged periods of time. Such exposure may lead to disc deformation.
- Upon playing a disc contaminated by dirt or other substances, the sound and video quality may deteriorate and result in skipping sounds. Writing on either side of the disc could result in damage to disc surfaces.
- Clean fingerprints and dust off the disc surface (coated side) with a soft cloth.
- Video CDs cannot be played. (However, such discs may still abnormally operate.)
- Do not to introduce foreign substances into the disc insert/eject slot. Introducing foreign substances could damage the device interior.

- Do not insert more than one disc at once. Such acts could lead to product damage or malfunctions.
- Do not forcefully eject or pull on discs when a disc is being loaded into the disc player. Such acts could lead to product damage or malfunctions.
- Non-genuine discs may result in disc recognition failure or product malfunction.

## **Before using USB Devices**

Turn the engine on before connecting a USB device for use. Connecting the USB device prior to turning on the ignition may lead to USB device damage.

- For MP3/WMA files, only music files with compression rates between 8Kbps ~ 768 Kbps can be played.
- Heed caution for static electricity when connecting/ disconnecting external USB devices.
- Encoded MP3 players will not be recognized when connected as an external device.
- When connecting an external USB device, the system may not properly recognize the USB in some states.
- This device recognize USB devices formatted in FAT 32, NTFS and exFAT.





#### **Selecting Broadcasts Automatically**

In FM/AM radio mode, press the  $\checkmark$ SEEK / TRACK keys on the head unit or press and hold the "V/ $\land$ " keys on the steering remote controller to continuously change and receive broadcasts with good reception.

### **Selecting Broadcasts from Presets**

This feature is used to listen to broadcasts saved to presets.

Up to 35 broadcasts can be saved as presets.

- 1. In FM/AM radio mode, press [Presets].
- 2. Select the desired preset number or use the " $\Lambda/V$ " keys on the steering remote controller to select the desired broadcast.



#### **Selecting Broadcasts from List**

- 1. In FM/AM radio mode, press ≡ or press MENU →[List].
- 2. Select the list with the desired broadcast or press the VSEEK / TRACK key to select the desired broadcast.

### **Precautions for Safe Driving**

- Operating the device while driving could lead to accidents due to a lack of attention to external surroundings. Do not operate the device while driving.
- Do not stare at the device while driving. Doing so could lead to traffic accidents.
- Always follow actual traffic conditions and regulations. Following only the route guidance can lead to violations of actual traffic regulations and cause traffic accidents.
- Some features cannot be operated while driving or when the vehicle is in motion.
- Road, name, and POI information may not always have been completely updated.
- The route displayed for destination guidance is a reference route that will take you to the vicinity of your destination. The highlighted route may not always be the shortest distance, the least congested, or the fastest route.
- The car position mark does not always indicate your exact location. Errors in displaying your current location may occur due to satellite conditions or your vehicle state (current driving location or conditions). Additionally, the car position mark may differ from the actual position if the map data is different from

- actual road landscapes caused by new road constructions. If such differences occur, driving for a short period of time will automatically correct the vehicle position through map matching or updates in GPS information. (Several minutes may be required in such cases.)
- This system uses GPS information, various sensors, and road map data to display the current position. However, errors in displaying your location may occur if the satellite is transmitting inaccurate signals or less than two signals are being received.
- Adjust the volume to appropriate levels while driving. Not doing so could lead to traffic accidents.
- Voice guidance may differ from actual road conditions. Always follow actual traffic conditions when driving.

What is Map Matching?

Map Matching is a feature that displays the current position mark on the most appropriate road after comparing current position information acquired through GPS information and roads that were used up to this point.

· What is GPS?

GPS (Global Positioning System): GPS is a system developed and operated by the United States which determines the user's current location (longitude/latitude information) by using three or more satellites. This system is used with related GPS information, various sensors, road map data, and other information to provide navigation quidance.

#### **About the Map**

Some roads, site names, and facility information may have changed after map data updates and could differ from actual road conditions.

#### **Information**

- For continued map updates, information gathering and surveys are conducted
  continuously to monitor road changes or new road constructions. Nonetheless,
  roads, facilities and fares are under constant change and it is not possible to
  completely remove all errors, including road updates, names, facilities and
  fares. Please keep this in mind when using the Navigation.
- In principle, roads with widths less than 3m are not included within the map data. Roads with sections with widths less than 3m may be deleted in future map data updates.

#### When GPS Info Cannot be Used

GPS may not operate under the following conditions.

- When passing buildings, tunnels, or other obstructions that block satellite signals.
- When materials are placed above the GPS antenna and block satellite signals.
- When satellites are not transmitting radio waves. (Radio waves may not transmit when undergoing modifications or repairs.)







#### What is Bluetooth?

- Bluetooth Wireless Technology refers to short-distance wireless networking technology which uses a 2.40~2.48 GHz frequency to connect various devices within a certain distance.
- Bluetooth handsfree refers to a device which allows the user to conveniently make phone calls with Bluetooth cell phones through the multimedia system.
- The Bluetooth handsfree feature may not be supported in some cell phones.

# **Precautions for Safe Driving**

- Excessive use or operation while driving may lead to negligent driving practices and cause accidents.
- Bluetooth handsfree is a feature that promotes safe driving practices. Connecting the head unit with a Bluetooth phone allows the user to conveniently make calls, receive calls, and manage contacts.
- Viewing the screen for prolonged periods of time is dangerous and may lead to accidents. When driving, view the screen only for short periods of time.

# Cautions when Connecting a Bluetooth Phone

- Before connecting the head unit with the cell phone, check to see that the cell phone supports Bluetooth features.
- Even if the phone supports Bluetooth, the phone cannot be connected with the head Unit when the connection mode is set to hidden state. Disable the hidden state before connecting the phone with the head Unit.
- The Bluetooth phone is automatically connected when the ignition is turned on, making it unnecessary to have to connect the phone with the head unit every time. (Refer to the "Auto Connection Priority" section on page 177.)
- When pairing is unsuccessful, please go to owners.genesis.com.

# Pairing and Connecting a Phone

## When No Phones are Paired (Pairing a New Device)

### **Using Voice Recognition**

#### **Creating a Suitable Cabin Environment**

Voice recognition technology allows you to operate the phone, AV and Navigation system through voice commands. To ensure optimal voice recognition performance, please do the following.

- Press the voice recognition key and say the command after system instructions and beep.
- Only commands listed within the user's manual are supported. Check the commands listed in the user's manual before starting use.
- For good voice recognition performance, maintain proper position when saying commands.
- · Voice recognition may be affected by ambient noise.
- High noise level due to high speed blower from air vents may lower the performance. Please avoid air vents direction towards the overhead consol.
- For improved voice recognition performance, make the environment quiet and speak the command in a moderate tone with clear pronunciation.
  - During voice recognition, adjust the volume to change voice guidance volume.
- Say commands naturally and clearly to ensure better performance.

- Monosyllable names saved within contacts may not be properly recognized. (Example: Tom, John)
- Contacts with special characters will not be recognized.
   (Example: John Doe Friend)
- Contacts with upper letters should be pronounced by letters. For numbers, digit-by-digit.

#### Voice Recognition Features by Language

Voice recognition supported features may vary for each languages. If the system language is set to Korean, this feature will not be supported.

### **Starting Voice Recognition**

Press the key on the steering remote controller.

#### **Information**

- If the voice recognition guidance is set to [Beginner] mode, then voice recognition guidance will provide with more detailed prompts.
- If set to [Normal], voice recognition guidance will provide short and simple prompts. For more information on voice recognition guidance, refer to the "Voice recognition settings" section on page 180.

#### **Skipping Voice Guidance Messages**

While voice guidance is being played, shortly press the key on the steering remote controller, it will immediately skip with a beep. Once the screen icon changes from to g, say the desired voice command.

#### **Automatic Collision Notification**

This feature provides immediate assistance when an accident occurs and an airbag is deployed. In the occurrence of such an event, an ACN signal containing customer and location information will automatically be transmitted to the response center. Upon receipt of the signal, a response specialist will attempt to establish voice communications with the vehicle occupants and forward any pertinent information to emergency services.

#### *i* Information –

 The Automatic Collision Notification feature is subject to adequate cellular coverage, signal strength, and battery power, and only available in the 50 United States. #### SOS

Occupants may request emergency 911 assistance by pressing the dedicated SOS key in the vehicle. Pressing the key will transmit vehicle information and location to trained response specialists who will assist in coordinating the dispatch of appropriate emergency assistance to the vehicle.

The response specialist will remain on the line until advised assistance has arrived.



#### Stolen Vehicle Recovery

In the event that a Genesis Connected Services vehicle is reported stolen (and a stolen vehicle report has been filed with the appropriate police department), the response center can provide assistance to law enforcement authorities in an attempt to recover the vehicle.

#### Vehicle Slowdown

- Within city streets, the current position may be displayed on the opposite side or off-road position.
- When changing the zoom level from maximum to a different level, the current position may become displayed on a different road.
